#### AGAPE PROGRAM

All of us at Agape appreciated the food and monetary donations CCRSPA gave us in December. Our organization serves approximately 250 children each week in 12 elementary schools in Cecil County. They are: Thomson Estates, Holly Hall, Gilpin Manor, Bainbridge, Perryville, North East, Conowingo, Elk Neck, Charlestown, Chesapeake City, Leeds, and Cecil Manor. Some schools are assisted by area churches (BV and RS), and some have indicated they do not need our help.

We provide a bag of food for the weekend to each child identified by the guidance counselors. A typical bag contains a can of pasta with meat, 2 soups, 2 fruits (applesauce, etc.), 2 snacks (goldfish crackers, granola bars, etc.), and 2 cereals. Our volunteers deliver these bags to the schools.

Our sources of funding include grants from the Video Lottery Terminal (Perryville Casino), Homeland Security and United Way. This year some local businesses, such as McCool Insurance, gave us large donations.

Our program is entirely volunteer-based. Victorious Life in Zion provides a building free-of-charge where we store and pack food. Our volunteers shop for the best deals on food, and there are occasional food drives to collect items at Grace Bible Chapel. We would be very grateful to receive donations from CCRSPA through the quarterly food collections at our luncheons.

### Items we need include:

Canned beef and pasta (Beefaroni, spaghetti & meatballs, etc.)

Granola bars

Ramen noodles

Individual fruit servings (applesauce, mandarin oranges, etc.) Canned soup (currently have a good supply)

Single-serve cereals (huge need)

Individual snack bags (Goldfish, pretzels, etc.)
