### CCRSPA MINUTES - May 17, 2022

The group gathered at 11:00 am at the Chesapeake Bay Golf Club in Rising Sun. President Anne Humphrey called the meeting to order at 11:17 am. We opened with the Pledge of Allegiance. New member, Karen Hartranft, introduced herself. The minutes from the December 7, 2021 were approved.

Treasurer's Report - Tony Mattern stated that we had \$7980.22 income and \$1889.37 expenditures. Any member who takes photos at a CCRSPA event is asked to send the photos to Tony for the website. Please notify Tony if you notice errors on the website. Tony quizzed the members on information regarding the website.

Correspondence - No report

Benefits - Paul Humphrey reported the cost of Aetna for 2022 went down due to a decline in usage in 2021 and will most likely go back up to that same 2021 level next year.

Community Outreach - Anne Humphrey presented a certificate to CCRSPA from MRSPA for the 2019-2020 Community Service Award Local Association Project Winner (200-899 members) for the Agape Program coordinated by Charlene Metzger. Anne presented a certificate from MRSPA for the 2021-2022 Community Service Individual Award - Honorable Mention to Kay DiStefano. Paula Sheldon thanked everyone for their donations of items requested by the school nurses as well as financial donations for the Kids Fund.

Constitution - No report

Consumer Education - Tony Mattern reminded members that a Car Fit event is occurring this Thursday in Rising Sun.

Legislation - Linda Elwood reported that this committee met biweekly from January through April. There were 18 members on the committee which included Jan Fraser and Shirley Hicks. This year 2596 bills were introduced. The committee reviewed select bills and supported 71 bills. Bills of significance that we supported and passed are: HB 420 Retirement Tax Elimination Act of 2022. There will be a tax reduction of \$10,000 in 2023 and an additional \$1000 each year until 2026. Single paying tax returns must make less than \$100,000 to gualify and a married couple less that \$150,000. Of concern was a billion-dollar deficit coming into the state resulting in less money going to the counties. Some members felt this might reduce that amount of healthcare coverage retirees receive. HB 0148 Criminal Law Stalking - Definition - This bill changes the definition of stalking to include using a device (computer, cell phone, GPS) that can pinpoint a person's location without their knowledge. Many seniors may not be aware that such devices exist or that they can be used for this purpose. HB 743 - Teachers' Retirement and Pension Systems - Reemployment - This bill allows school systems to hire retired teachers. Systems can now hire 25 retirees and they may return to the school where they worked. HB 166 Alzheimer's Disease and Dementia - Council and Coordination Services - This council will issue and publish an update to the State Plan on Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementias and establish the position of Director of Dementia Service and Brain Health to facilitate communication about service in the state. Our pensions are fine. This year's COLA for pensions will be 3% and members in the old retirement system will receive 4.698%. AARP and the Legislative Committee continue to warn our members about third party electric suppliers. Unregulated portions of the bill will increase over time costing customers up to \$700 more per year. They are targeting the older population.
